

Small Heath School and Sixth Form Centre GCE Advanced Level Results 2011

We are absolutely delighted with the “A” Level results achieved by our students this year. Overall, there has been increased attainment by our students compared to last year. The average point score per student has increased by 22 points, we are particularly pleased that students of both genders achieved equally well in this respect with boys and girls achieving average point scores of 207 UCAS points.

54% of entries resulted in grades “A-C” with 69% of students achieving 3 “A” level passes. We expect the percentage of students achieving 3 “A” level passes to continue to be considerably above the national average this year. This in itself is a remarkable achievement for a school located in one of the most deprived areas of the country. 99.5% of our children originate from ethnic minority backgrounds and 94% of students speak English as an additional language.

Noteworthy results were achieved by our Head Boy, Shakeel Ahmed with two grade “A”s in Chemistry and Maths and a grade “B” in Biology, Sahar Ali and Kashif Jamil who both achieved grade “A”s in Religious Education and Sociology and grade “B”s in History, Gulshada Begum with grade “A”s in Biology and Sociology and a grade “B” in Chemistry, and Waleed Mughal who achieved two grade “A”s in Chemistry and Maths and a grade “C” in Biology.

The Governors, Headteacher and staff of Small Heath School would like to take the opportunity to congratulate our students on their success this year, which has been well deserved and also to thank their families for their continued support of the school and its students.
