

Small Heath School GCE Advanced Level Results 2009

We are particularly pleased that our “A” level results this year have reflected the dedication to study shown by our students and the commitment to quality learning and teaching demonstrated by all colleagues who have supported them.

Fourteen subjects achieved 100% pass rates from a non – selective entry. Almost two thirds of entries resulted in A to C grades.

This year, 52% of students achieved three “A” Level pass grades, this is a particularly high percentage of students to achieve this standard for a school located in such a deprived inner city area. We are expecting these results to compare very well with national statistics. Consistently, more than twice the national average percentage of students in our school are entered for three “A” Levels and more than three times the national average are entered for two.

There is no doubt that the excellent collaboration between our colleagues, students and their families is a formula for success.

Girls achieved higher percentages in all categories of analysis this year, however, attainment has been shown to be related to the ability of the student rather than to gender in our school.

Particularly outstanding results were achieved by Farah Din (grade A’s in Art and Design, Textiles, English and a grade B in Psychology), Amil Khan (grade A’s in History, English and Sociology), Neelam Rahni also achieved three grade A’s in Religious Studies, English and Sociology, Sahira Saeed achieved three Grade A’s in History, English and Sociology, and Nabila Shah who achieved three Grade A’s in English, Psychology and Religious Studies.

Many more students will be attending the university courses of their choice this year, Mr. P. Slough, Headteacher, and staff wish to offer all of them our heartfelt congratulations on their well deserved success.

The results this year have risen again with 63% of pupils achieving 5 or more A*-C grades and 42% achieving this standard with English and Mathematics. Particularly outstanding results were achieved by pupils in Maths, IT, Science and RE short course subjects.

Boys performed particularly well with 64% achieving 5 or more A*-C grades.

All pupils attending the school in Year 11 achieved qualifications.

Pupils with exceptional results were Iram Qureshi who achieved 12.5 good GCSE passes with 11 of them being A or A* grades, Hafsa Ali who achieved 12.5 good GCSE passes with 9.5 of them being A or A* grades and Mumtaz Hussain who achieved 11.5 good GCSE passes with 8 of them being A or A* grades.
